NOTE ON THE ADOPTION OF THE NEW ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The Articles of Association of St Helens Chamber Limited were last updated in 2016. In order to bring them up to date amendments have been made.

Special Resolution 3 proposes that the amended Articles of Association be adopted as the Articles of Association of St Helens Chamber Limited in substitution for and to the exclusion of the existing Articles of Association.

Changes to the Articles of Association have been made in order to use more gender-neutral language and to update some more dated terminology. The summary table overleaf provides an overview of the main changes to the Company's Articles of Association.
